2	What are the considerations?	 Improve GPA W indicates that you left the course before getting a final grade. W doesn't necessarily mean that you weren't passing the course. U indicates that you did not pass the course. U or W both hurt your satisfactory academic progress for financial aid purposes. Continue Progression to Graduation If none of your courses are prerequisites for other courses you may want to keep your grades and not do S/U, even if you are getting D in a course. If you are not able to get the required grade that is a prerequisite for another course you maybe want to take the S/U or W to save your GPA. U does not give you credits towards the 120-credits needed to graduate. If a course has a prerequisite as Junior status but you didn't get enough credits, you may have to wait until you have enough credits. 			
3	How does S/U grading impact my academic standing?	 Academic Standing Your academic standing (good standing/probation) will be determined by the letter grades that you earn at the end of the semester. If your cumulative gpa is below a 2.0 at the end of the fall semester, and by choosing the S/U grading option your gpa improves to a 2.0 or above, you will be overridden to good standing for Spring 21. If you choose to take all S grades or all U grades, you will maintain the same academic standing that you earned with your letter grades. If you are a first semester freshman and have a gpa below a 1.0, you are eligible for an Accelerated Fresh Start. 			
4	What are the stipulations?	 Competitive majors will not accept an S in place of a required B letter grade for admission. S/U grading may not be used for a capstone course.
